to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all tithes
arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of
Moyfale in the County of Limerick. So hereby certify that
the true and just amount of Composition for all tithes
whatsoever within the said Parish is one hundred and fifty
pounds sp by the year. The entire of which sum is due
and payable to Thomas Ellis of Mottstown in the County
of Dublin Esq as a composition for the tithes claimable by
him as owner of a moiety of the Rectorial Tithes of said Parish.
And we do further certify that the average price of oats
being the Corn principally grown in said County for the
period of seven years ending on the 1st day of November 1821
is fifteen shillings and sixpence fourthings save according
to the average of prices extracted from the Dublin Gazette
