For all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Two Hundred and Thirty seven pounds Ster. by the year, of
Which Sum of Two Hundred & thirty seven Pounds Ster., One Hundred and seventeen pound Ster. is due and
Payable to the Rev. Geo. Hartigan as a composition for all Tithes claimable by him as Rector and Vicar
of the said Parish of Abbeygormigan Fifty Five Pounds Ster. is due and payable to the Rev. Richard Byrne
As Prebendary of Tinne, Eleven Pounds Ster. is due and payable to the Rev. Alex. Macaulay as Prebendary
of Millshill Fifteen Pounds Ster. is due and payable to the Venerable Archdeacon Bulson as Archdeacon of
Clonsfert Five Pounds Ster. is due and payable to the Rev. Thos. Hawkins as Dean of Clonsfert Nine Pounds
is due and payable to the Rev. Richard Vincent as Prebendary of Kitquain and Twenty five Pounds is
Due and payable to the Bishop of the Diocese of Clonsfert

And we do further Certify that the average Price of oats being the Corn Principally grown in such
County for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1725 twenty one is ten Shillings
And six pence ⁸/₁₀ by the barrel - Given under our hands and seals this thirteenth day of Oct. 1723
