

To all to whom these presents shall come, I the Rev<sup>d</sup>  
John Shea, Vicar of the Parish of Abinglara in the county  
of Longford, send greeting - Whereas, Francis Joseph Esq<sup>r</sup> of Mount  
Joseph in the county of Longford, has truly served me with  
a notice in writing, in the words and figures following;  
"In, you are hereby required to take notice, that in pursuance  
of an act passed in the 2<sup>d</sup> & 3<sup>d</sup> years of his present Majesty  
entitled an act to amend three acts passed respectively  
in the 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, and in the seventh and eighth years of the  
reign of his late Majesty, King George the Fourth, providing  
for establishing of compositions for tithes in Ireland, and to  
make such compositions permanent, I Francis Joseph of  
Mount Joseph in the county of Longford being seized  
in fee simple of all that and those the townlands of  
Castroamarkey and Tubber, situate in the Parish of  
Abinglara barony of Granard and county of Longford,  
and therefore entitled, according to the provisions of said  
act, to agree for, and undertake the payment of the  
compositions for tithes, lawfully payable for and in  
respect of such lands, do hereby signify to you my  
desires to agree for and undertake the payment of  
such composition as aforesaid, for and in respect of  
the said lands; and I hereby require you to grant  
me a certificate, in writing, conformable to the provision  
of said act, declaring me entitled to the benefit of this  
notice, and to perform the other matters on your  
part required by the said act to be done -
