

I John Stephens a Commissioner duly appointed thereon under and by virtue of  
 an Act passed in the 2<sup>d</sup> & 3<sup>d</sup> years of the reign of his present Majesty King William  
 the 4<sup>th</sup> Intituled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the 14<sup>th</sup> 15<sup>th</sup> and  
 in the 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth providing  
 for the establishing of Compositions for tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions  
 permanent to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all tithes arising  
 growing yielded or payable within the parish of Abbeytown in the Diocese of  
 Kells and County of Wick I do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for  
 all tithes whatever within the said parish is six hundred and fifty five pounds by the year  
 of which the sum of three hundred and six pounds eight shillings and nine pence is due and  
 payable to Thomas Baldwin of Dublin & Mrs. Maria Baldwin of same place out of a portion  
 of said parish to wit the lands of Clonhill Green Kilmalrude Cottingrange Ullinacashy  
Clonroche or Liosclonig Mulmahona Donylagga Milbournville Inchmagogh Hillybrook  
Sea Carraigalla Bawnagallpa & Currow with their subdivisions as lessees of the tithes  
 of said portion of said parish under a lease the 1<sup>st</sup> bearing date the nineteenth day of December  
 one thousand eight hundred & seven for the term of nine hundred and sixty years  
 commencing from the day of the date thereof executed by John Sealy Townsend of the City  
 of Dublin Esquire and otherwise Hancock his wife and Richard Townsend and Anne his  
 wife lay impropriators of said tithes unto the said Thomas Baldwin and Mrs. Maria Baldwin  
 and the sum of one hundred and two pounds four shillings & two pence the part of  
 the said sum of six hundred & fifty five pounds is due & payable as follows one part thereof to wit  
 the sum of forty seven pounds four shillings & two pence is due and payable to Thomas  
 Baldwin & Mrs. Maria Baldwin as such lessees as aforesaid & the other part thereof  
 to wit the sum of fifty five pounds is due and payable to the Reverend Messrs. B. McCarty  
 Rector & Vicar of the parish of Craugh the said last mentioned sum of one hundred and  
 two pounds four shillings & two pence being so due and payable out of part of the  
 above portion of said parish to wit the lands of Staprough Cherryford do Bushard  
Cobnagachy & Demigale with their subdivisions and the sum of two hundred & forty  
 six pounds seven shillings & one penny the residue of the aforesaid sum of six hundred and  
 fifty five pounds is due and payable to Stephen Sweetnam of Marryke out of the other  
 portion of the said parish to wit the lands of Corra abbeytown Sea lahty daly & a  
the Marsh Phon U Lisheenapragine Doonamullale Doonig Liosclonig Bawnagallane  
Keenamon Clonabally and Deels with their subdivisions as lessees of the tithes of  
 said last mentioned portion of said parish under a lease the 1<sup>st</sup> bearing date the nineteenth  
 day of December one thousand eight hundred and seven for the term of nine hundred  
 and sixty years commencing from the day of the date thereof executed by John Sealy Townsend  
 and Anne Townsend otherwise Hancock his wife and Richard Townsend eldest son of the said  
 John Sealy Townsend and Anne his wife lay impropriators.

And I further Certify that the average price of Oats being the Corn principally  
 grown within the said County for the period of seven years ending the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November  
 one thousand eight hundred and thirty is twelve shillings & eleven pence half penny  
 per Barrel
