

Vicariage tithes or portions of tithes or other
or portions thereof has or have been, or shall be
incurred to any vicariage or perpetual curacy
pursuant to the provisions of said Statute?
And Whereas it appears to us to be expedient
to carry into effect the Powers hereby in us
vested, and to annex the Parsonage of the said
Prebend of Faldoune to the said Parish of Cahill
and Vicariage of Cahill We hereby order &
direct that the said Rectorial Tithes and
all of them so annexed as aforesaid to
the said Prebend of Faldoune shall be, and
the same are hereby deemed and declared to be
therefrom, and annexed and united for ever to the
said Parish of Cahill, and shall be paid
and payable as any Rent Charge or Rent Charge
established in lieu of the same by the said
Statute Act of the first and second years
of the reign of His present Majesty shall
be paid and payable to the Incumbent of the
said Parish of Cahill for the time being for
ever, and possessed by him in as full right as
the same here are possessed by the late or any
former Incumbent of the said Prebend and
recovered and recoverable by the same Suits and
processes as the same were ever or might by law
have been recovered or recoverable by any Incumbent
of said Prebend There being no cure of souls
in the said Prebend of Faldoune or annexed

to the said portions of Rectorial Tithes, any of them
heretofore constituting the Curse thereof and by the Powers
transferred and annexed to the said Parish of Cahill and
the Right of Presentation to the said Prebend of Faldoune
and the said Parish of Cahill being vested only in the
Bishops of Tuam it is unnecessary to make any order either
as to any transfer of cure of souls or the Right of
Presentation to the said Parish of Cahill as hereby
augmented
