

We William Rose and John Christy Commissioners duly appointed  
and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of  
the reign of King George the fourth, "intituled" An act to provide for  
the Establishing of Compositions for Tythes in Ireland for a  
limited time" to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition  
for all Tythes arising growing, yielded or payable within the  
Parish of Arklow in the Diocese of Limerick, do hereby Certify, that  
the true and just amount of Compositions for all Tythes whatever  
within the said Parish is Eight hundred and Eight Pounds five  
Shillings and five pence by the year; of which sum of Eight  
hundred and Eight Pounds five Shillings and five pence, Five  
hundred and six Pounds eight Shillings and six pence are  
due and payable to the Right Honorable the Earl of Lonsdown  
as a Composition for the Tythe claimable by him as owner of  
the Rectorial Tythe of the said Parish; and Three Hundred and  
one Pounds sixteen Shillings and eleven pence are due and payable  
to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Edward Croker the Vicar of the said Parish -

And we do further Certify, That the average price of  
Wheat being the Corn principally grown in such County, for the  
period of seven years, ending on the first day of November 1821  
is fifteen Shillings and two pence farthing per Bushel
