And it further appearing by the
~~said~~ Report in writing of the said
William Gilbert that the average price
of oats for the last 7 years
was 11/10⁰ sterling per Barre
according to the returns published
in the Dublin Gazette It is ordered
by the said Justices that the sum of
£184.12.3½ being the composition
mentioned in said Certificate, as
payable to the said Duke of
Devonshire be diminished by a
sum of £28.16.1 sterling leaving
said £155.16.2½ annually and
that pursuant to the Statute of 11th
and 20th Vic cap 109 the Rent
charge in lieu thereof payable
to the Duke of Devonshire or
those deriving under him shall be
3/4^{ths} of the said sum of £155.16.2½
sterling that is to say £116.17.2
annually and that the same shall
commence from the 1st day of ~~May~~^{Nov}
1889 And it is further ordered
that the assessment and apportionment

of the said Composition shall be
amended accordingly and that the
apportionment of the Rectorial Tithes Rent
charge in lieu thereof payable to the
Duke of Devonshire ~~be~~^{be} reduced and
diminished in like proportion AND
it is further ordered that the
applicants do pay to the Solicitors
for the Duke of Devonshire the
sum of £3.3.0 for the costs of
appearing on such application
and that the said applicants do also
pay to the said William Gilbert the
sum of £2.2.0 as and for his fee
for amending and altering the ~~original~~
apportionment in accordance with this
order.
