We Thomas Spencer Lindsay Esq^r and the Rev^d John Meenan
Bleek Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by
Vertue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King
George the Fourth entitled an Act to provide for the establishing
of Compositions for the Tithes in Ireland for a limited time
to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes
arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Cong
in the Counties of Mayo and Galway Do hereby Certify that the
true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever
Redeemable Vicarial and Prebendal within the said Parish save
and except the Improper Tithes within the said Parish due and
payable to Sir Noel O'Donnell Bart is the sum of Five Hundred
and Thirty Pounds by the year of which sum of Five hundred and
thirty Pounds, Seventy Pounds Sterling yearly appears to have been
the average due and payable to the Prebendary of Kellakepp
for seven years preceding the first day of November 1821 as a
Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as such Prebendary
and the remaining sum of Five hundred and ten Pounds is the
sum due and payable to the Rev^d Cecil Crompton as Rector of
the said Parish as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him
And We do further Certify that the average Price of Wheat
being the Corn principally grown in the County of Galway for the
period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1821
is thirty eight Shillings and eight pence half penny per Barrel
and the average price of Oats being the Corn principally grown in the
County of Mayo for the period of seven years ending on the first day
of November 1821 is fifteen Shillings and two pence half penny
per Barrel
