

We William M. Kelly and Richard O'Connell Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth Intituled, "An act to provide for the establishing of compositions for tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the parish of Conry in the County of Westmeath, do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of composition for all tithes whatever within the said parish is sixty five pounds per year of which sum of sixty five pounds, forty pounds are due payable to the most noble and religious House of Downshire as a composition for the tithes claimable by him as Proprietor of the Rectorial tithes of said parish and the remaining twenty five pounds are due and payable to the Reverend Stephen Radcliffe and the Reverend Roger Ford as owners of the vicarial tithes of said parish —

and we do further certify that the average price of oats being the corn principally grown in said County for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1821 is fifteen shillings and two pence farthing, late Irish currency, per barrel —
