Crompton Bart. owner of the Rectory or Lay Impropriate
Tithes of the said Parish of Mohill. and Ten hundred
and thirty Six pounds Six Shillings and four pence
halfpenny is due and payable to the Rev. Arthur Hyde
as Vicar of said Parish.

And I do further Certify that the average price
paid being the Corn principally grown in such County
for the three years ending the first day of November
1830. is Twelve Shillings and eleven pence halfpenny per bush.
