

And We award that Thirty five acres and twenty perches marked Fourth
quantity and worth ten Shillings per acre shall pay the Sum of Seven pence per acre
and so in proportion for Roads and perches as a Composition for all the Tythes thereof
and finally we find that the above mentioned Sums payable out of the above
quantity of Land makes the Sum of Three Hundred and Twelve pounds, nine Shillings
and Six pence halfpenny the being the Sum agreed on between the different parties
as a Composition for all the Tythes Great and Small of Said Parish - All the
Surveys are made in Irish plantation measure, Roads not Included - and all
Sums of Money mentioned are in British Currency Given under our hands and Seals
this Second day of June in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred
and Seventy seven -
