

We Richard Waddy Esq and Samuel Atkins, Commissioners duly appointed
and sworn in order and by Virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the
Reign of King George the Fourth intituled "An Act to provide for the establishing
of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited Time," to ascertain and fix
a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable
within the Parish of Antrauscat in the County of Westford, do hereby certify
That the Sum of Two Hundred Pounds by the Year has been fixed and agreed
upon by and between the Reverend Frederick Draper, Ecclesiastical Incumbent,
and a Special Vestry duly assembled for said Parish, under and by Virtue
of the Provision contained in the said Act, in the fifth year of the said
King George the Fourth intituled "an Act to amend an Act of the last Session
of Parliament for providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in
Ireland," as the amount of Compositions for all Tithes whatsoever, within the
said Parish, invariable for and during the Term of Twenty one Year from the
first day of November next; That the said Agreement to warr for the sum of
Two Hundred Pounds by the Year has received the Consent and Approbation
of the Right Reverend Thomas Springton D. D. Lord Bishop of Litchfield and
Leicester, as Bishop of the Diocese of Ferns wherein the said Parish is situate
and Patron of the said Parish, pursuant to the last herein mentioned Act;
and that the whole of the said Sum is due and payable to the said
Reverend Frederick Draper as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him
as Rector of the said Parish. Given under our Hands the fourth day of
