

The Stephen Wright and John Duhane Commissioners  
duly appointed and sworn by Virtue of an Act made  
in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth  
intituled "An act to provide for the Establishing of  
Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time  
to ascertain and fix a true and Just composition for all  
Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the  
Parish of Attaura in the Counties of Kilkenny and  
queens County, do hereby Certify, that the true and  
Just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever  
within the said Parish is One Hundred and Thirty  
Eight pounds, nine shillings and two pence three  
farthings British of which Sum of One Hundred  
and Thirty Eight Pounds nine shillings and two  
pence three farthings British, two parts are due  
and payable to the Honble and Rev<sup>d</sup> Arthur  
Vesey as a composition for the Tithes claimable  
by him as Rector of the said Parish, and one part  
is due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Thos<sup>d</sup> H. Kearney  
the Vicar as owner of the Vicarial Tithes of the  
said Parish Annually And we do further Certify,  
that the average price of Wheat being the Corn  
principally grown in the County of Kilkenny for the  
period of Seven years ending on the first day of  
November 1821 one, is One Pound fifteen  
shillings and Eight pence three farthings  
British for Barrel, and that the average price  
of Oats being the Corn principally grown in  
the
