the fourth providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and  
to make such Compositions permanent" to ascertain and fix a true and  
Just Composition for all Tithes arising growing Yearly & payable within  
the Parish of Moybologue Alias Ballyboro in the Counties of Louth  
and Meath. I do hereby Certify that the true and just Amount of  
Composition for all Tithes whatever within said Parish is Two Hun-  
-dred and Thirty nine pounds Sterling by the Year And that the same  
are and payable to the Revd John Gumbly Rector and Vicar of  
said Parish And I do further Certify that the Average Price of  
Tithes being the Corn principally grown in such Counties for the Period  
of Seven Years ending on the first day of November 1830 this is  
Twelve Shillings and Fourpence Halpenny Sterling per BARRIL.
