Whereas due notice having been first
affixed at the times and in the manner directed by the Statute
in such case made and provided by the Revend George
Stone Rector of the Parish of Ballygarry in the County of
Limerick being the party entitled to and in the actual receipt
of the rentcharge in kind of Tithe Compositioe arising and
payable in respect of the several lands chargeable therewith
in the said Parish of Ballygarry in the County and Division
of Limerick in pursuance of a certain Certificate bearing
date the twenty third day of October 1829 whereby the
gross amount of Composition for all tithes whatever within
the said Parish was certified to be the annual sum of Two
hundred and fifty pounds, the said Revend George Stone
as such Rector of said Parish as aforesaid made an application
submitting to the Justices of the Peace of the said County at
the said Sessions above mentioned to have the average price
of Oats being the grain in the said Certificate mentioned
for the preceding seven years in the Statutes in that behalf
mentioned enquired of and ascertained in order that the
said Composition and the Rentcharge in like thereof might
be varied and increased according to such average price
as compared with the price or sum of nine shillings
and four pence per barrel being the price of oats set forth
