By the Justices of the Peace for the County of Limerick, at a General Sessions of the Peace, holden at Limerick in and for the Division and County of Limerick aforesaid, on the twenty second day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty four

Whereas due notice having been first affixed at the times and in the manner directed by the Statute in such case made and provided by the Reverend George Stone Rector of the Parish of Ballingarry in the County of Limerick being the party entitled to and in the actual receipt of the butchergage in lieu of Tithe Composition arising and payable in respect of the several lands chargeable therewith in the said Parish of Ballingarry in the County and Division of Limerick in pursuance of a certain Certificate bearing date the twenty third day of October 1829 whereby the gross amount of Composition for all tithes whatever within the said Parish was certified to be the annual sum of Two Hundred and fifty pounds, the said Reverend George Stone as such Rector of said Parish as aforesaid made an application submitting to the Justices of the Peace of the said County at the said Sessions above mentioned to have the average price of Oats being the grain in the said Certificate mentioned for the preceding seven years in the Statute in that behalf mentioned enquired of and ascertained in order that the said Composition and the butchergage in lieu thereof might be varied and increased according to such average price as compared with the price or sum of nine shillings and four pence per barrel being the price of oats set forth
