To Wit

By the Justices assigned to keep
the Peace in and for the County of
Limerick at a General Session of the
Peace Holden at Rathkeale in and for the Division of Rathkeale
in the said County of Limerick on the 3rd day of October 1889.

Whereas by certificate in writing dated 5th
August 1826 signed by John S. Browne junior and Michael
Synch Commissioners duly appointed under the Act 4th George
IV. c. 99 it was certified that at a vestry duly held on the
24th day of July 1826 in the Parish Church of Ballingarry in the
County of Limerick it was agreed on by the Parishioners and
accepted by the Vicar and Lay Impropriator that the sum of
£900 should be the composition for the Vicarial and restoral
Tithes of the said Parish by the year for the term of 21 Years
from the 1st day of November then next

And whereas due notice in writing having
been first affixed at the times and in the manner directed by the
Statute in such case made and provided signed by Edmond
Moroney Thomas Gosberry James O'Shaugnessy and Michael
Scanlon (four owners or occupiers of land in the said Parish
of Ballingarry charged with payment of £3 or upwards each
in respect of such composition) of an application on behalf of
them the said Edmond Moroney Thomas Gosberry James
O'Shaugnessy and Michael Scanlon to the Justices of the
Peace of the County of Limerick assembled at Quarter Sessions
held at Rathkeale on the 13th day of June 1889 to have the said
Composition and little Rent Charge in such Parish varied and
for that purpose to have the average price of wheat for the 7
years preceding the year 1826 and for the 7 years preceding the
year 1889 inquired of and ascertained in order that the Composition
