

for Tithes and Tithes Rent Charge in the said Parish of Ballingarry might be varied and diminished for the ensuing 7 Years in proportion to such average price And whereas said application having come on for hearing at Rathskale on the said 13<sup>th</sup> day of June 1889 and Mr. Wood G. Jefferson instructed by Messrs. Jonas Blackhall and Son having appeared of counsel for the said Tithes Rent payers in support of said application and Messrs. Sellers and Fitt having appeared on behalf of the persons entitled to the Improprate Tithes Rent Charge in said Parish and the said Notice of application and Certificate and that the said Edmund Moroney Thomas Fosberry James O'Shaughnessy and Michael Scantlan were entitled to make such application having been proved the said Justice granted the application and referred it to Mr. James Green Barry to ascertain from the Dublin Gazette the average price of wheat for the 7 Years preceding 1<sup>st</sup> November 1826 and for the 7 years preceding 13<sup>th</sup> June 1889 and make his report to the Clerk of the Peace and adjourned the application to the next Sessions And whereas the said James Green Barry duly made his Report in writing Now we the said Justice do ascertain from the said Dublin Gazette that the average price of wheat for the 7 Years preceding the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1826 was one pound ten shillings and seven pence three farthings per barrel of 20 Stone and that the average price of wheat for the seven years preceding the 13<sup>th</sup> day of June 1889 was Eighteen shillings and ten pence three farthings per barrel of 20 Stone as aforesaid and we do accordingly order and adjudge that the amount of the said Composition for Tithes and Tithes Rent Charge in lieu thereof in the said Parish of Ballingarry in the Division of Rathskale and County of Limerick aforesaid other than such Rent Charges as

became vested in the Commissioners of Church Temporalities in Ireland shall be diminished for the 7 Years next ensuing the first day of November 1889 in the proportion that the said sum of one pound ten shillings and seven pence three farthings bears to the said sum of Eighteen shillings and ten pence three farthings and that the appointment of such Composition be amended accordingly and we do further order and adjudge that the said Edmund Moroney Thomas Fosberry James O'Shaughnessy and Michael Scantlan the applicants do pay to the said James Green Barry the sum of £15. 15. 0 as and for his Costs and Expenses of said arbitration and report. And that the said applicants and the persons entitled to the Improprate Tithes Rent Charge in said Parish do respectively abide their own Costs of the said application and all proceedings had thereunder.
