of Limerick on the 3rd day of October, 1889,

Whereas by Certificate in writing dated
5th. August, 1826, signed by John S. Brown junior
and Michael Lynch Commissioners duly appointed
under the Act IV. George IV. C. 99 it was certified
that at a vestry duly held on the 24th. day of
July, 1826, in the Parish Church of Ballingarry
in the County of Limerick it was agreed on
by the Parishioners and accepted by the Vicar
and lay Improvigator that the sum of £900;
should be the composition for the Vicarial
and Rectorial Tithes of the said Parish by the
year for the term of 21 years from the 1st. day
of November then next.

And whereas due notice in writing having
been first affixed at the times and in the manner
directed by the Statutes in such case made and
provided signed by Edmund Moroney, Thomas
Fosberry, James O'Shaughnessy and Michael
Scanlan (four owners or occupiers of land
in the said Parish of Ballingarry charged
with payment of £3, or upwards each in respect
of such composition) of an application on behalf
of them the said Edmund Moroney, Thomas Fosberry,
James O'Shaughnessy and Michael Scanlan to
the Justices of the Peace of the County of Limerick
assembled at Quarter Sessions held at Rathkeale
