 pounds Sterling the sum agreed upon at a Special Vestry held  
 in the Church of Ballintemple on the sixth day of October last  
 between the very Reverend W<sup>m</sup> Maguire Dean of Melmor and the  
 Special vestry men appointed by said parish under and v.  
 Act is a just and full value for all Tithes payable to him  
 as vicar of said parish has been fairly and justly apploted  
 by us in S. parish as appears by the above calculation
