

We Walter Green of Coleridge and Philip Doyle of Tallace Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by Virtue of an Act made in the 15th Year of George the fourth intituled an Act to provide for establishing Compositions for tithes in Ireland for a limited Time, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all tithes arising growing, Yielding or payable within the Parish of Ballinacorney in the Union of St. Mary New Ross in the County of Wexford, do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all tithes whatsoever within the said Parish for twenty One Years from the first Day of May 1825 is Two Hundred and Forty Three Pounds Three Shillings and Six pence Halfpenny British Currency by the Year, being at the rate of One Shilling and Nine pence Farthing Brit. upon each and every actual Tithable Acre in said Parish as agreed upon between the Parishioners of said Parish, and the Rev^d James Allorgan the Rector thereof and that the said Sum is due and payable to the said Rev^d James Allorgan as a composition for the tithes claimable by him as Rector of the said Parish

Signed by us as Commissioners this 21st Day of May 1827.
