

We Alexander Mullen and Samuel Gray Commissioners duly Appointed
and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the Fifth Year of
the reign of King George the Fourth Intituled an Act for the Composition of Tithes
in Ireland, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes
arising Growing Yielding or payable within the Parish of Ballibay in the
County of Monaghan, do hereby certify that the Amount of Composition
for all Tithes whatever within the Parish of Ballibay is Three hundred
and Sixty five Guineas Sterling by the Year being the Amount agreed upon
between the Rev. Nicolas Langrishe Incumbent of the said Parish and
the Parishioners, duly assembled at a Vestry on the 2^d day of September One
Thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty Eight under said Act all which said
Sum of Three hundred and Sixty five Guineas Sterling is due and payable
to the said Rev. Nicolas Langrishe as Rector of said Parish of Ballibay
And we do further certify that the average price of Oats being the corn
principally grown in said Parish in said County for the Period of
seven Years ending on the 1st Day of November One Thousand Eight Hundred
and Twenty One is Fifteen Shillings and two pence halfpenny And We in
Order to prevent Delinquency at the Expiration of this Agreement for Composition
of Tithes do further certify and declare that the only thing for which Tithes has
been hitherto paid in the said Parish of Ballibay is Wheat, Rye, Oats, Barley
and Oats.
