

for all Tithes arising, growing yielded
or payable within the Parish of
Ballycahill in the County of Tipperary
did certify under his hand that the
true and just amount of the composition
for all Tithes whatever within the
said Parish of Ballycahill was
£246-6-10½ by the year which sum was
due and payable to Mr. Philip Fogarty
as a composition for the Lay Tithes
claimable by him as a Lessee of the
Improperiate Tithes of said Parish
of which sum of £246-6-10½ the sum of
£18-11-½ was added being the proportional
amount of said composition for the
Tithes of a part of the Townland or
denomination called Castle Fogarty
in said Parish the payment of which
was to be satisfied (for the term of 5000 years
by the Tindar of a pepper corn annually
if demanded and the said Robert Buchanan
did further certify that the average price
of wheat being the corn principally
grown in such county for the period
of 7 years ending on the first day of
November 1820 was £1-12-0½ per barrell
