

I Robert Buchanan Junior, Commissioner duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an act made in the second and third years of the Reign of King William the Fourth, entitled "An Act to amend Three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth and Fifth, and in the Seventh and Eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent," to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all tithes, arising growing yielding or payable, within the Parish of Ballycshil, in the County of Tipperary, do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Two hundred and forty-six pounds, six shillings and ten pence halfpenny by the year - which sum of Two hundred and forty-six pounds, six shillings and ten pence halfpenny ~~is~~ is due and payable to Mr Philip Fogarty as a composition for the Tithes claimable by him as a Lessee of the Improperiate Tithes of said Parish

And I do further certify, that of the above sum of Two hundred and forty-six pounds, six shillings and ten pence halfpenny - the sum of Eighteen pounds seven shillings and one penny halfpenny, has been added by me, being the proportionate amount of said Composition for the tithes of a part of the Townland or denomination called Castlefagarty, in said Parish, the payment of which, by a lease made by the aforesaid Philip Fogarty for the term of Five Thousand years, is to be satisfied by the tender of a peck of corn annually if demanded. And I do further certify that the ^{average} price of Wheat being the corn principally grown in such County, for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1830 is one pound twelve shillings and one halfpenny per Barrel - Dated this 14th day of November 1833 -
