

At an aysance Vestry held in the parish  
Church of Ballycommon on the fourth day of Feb<sup>r</sup> 1824  
agreeable to an Act passed in the fourth year of King George  
the fourth, entitled an Act to provide for the establishing  
compositions for tithes in Ireland for a limited time  
of which Vestry due and legal notice was given agreeable  
to the provisions of said Act for the purpose of electing  
a commissioner to act on the part of the parishioners of  
parish of Ballycommon in the place of W<sup>m</sup> Scully Esq<sup>r</sup>  
who has refused to act for us as commissioner on our part,  
We have therefore convened this Vestry for the purpose of electing  
another commissioner in place of M<sup>r</sup> Scully who declined  
acting on the part of us the Parishioners aforesaid.  
When and where John Warren Esq<sup>r</sup> of Wallieral was duly  
elected by vote to be a commissioner for us the Parishioners of  
Ballycommon aforesaid, for the purpose of ascertaining, fixing  
and making certain a composition in lieu of tithes in  
parish of Ballycommon as mutually agreed upon by us  
(and) the incumbent at the Original Special Vestry  
held in the said Church for that purpose—Having therefore  
unanimously chosen the S<sup>r</sup> John Warren Esq<sup>r</sup> to act— as
