I James Fraser <sup>Commissioner</sup> duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act passed in the 2<sup>d</sup> and 3<sup>d</sup> years of the reign of his present Majesty King William the fourth entitled "an act to amend three acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, and seventh and eighth years of our late Majesty King George the fourth providing for the establishing of composition for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent" to ascertain and fix a true & just composition for all Tithes arising, yielding growing or payable within the Parish of Ballyhooley and County of Cork do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is four hundred and sixty eight pounds by the year the whole of which is hereby due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Wm Butler as a composition for the Tithes claimed by him as Rector of the said Parish.—

And I do further certify that the average price of Wheat, being the Corn principally grown in said County for the period of seven years ending the 1<sup>st</sup> of November 1830 is one pound twelve shillings and a halfpenny per barrel.
