Ballyheige, in the County of Kerry, do hereby certify
that the true & just amount of Composition for all Tithes
whenever within the said Parish is Three Hundred &
Fifteen Pounds Sterling by the year, which sum is due
& payable to the Rev. James P. Chute, as Rector & Vicar
of the said Parish. - And we do further certify
that the average Price of Oats being the Corn principally
grown in such County for the Period of seven years end-
ing on the 31st day of October 1821 is nine Shillings & Four
