WE, HENRY BAGGE and JOHN POWER, Commissioners duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the Fourth, entitled, "An Act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland," for a limited time, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Ballylanken, in the Diocese of Lismore, and County of Waterford, do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever, within the said Parish, is Three Hundred and Seventy-eight Pounds, Ten Shillings, British, by the year, of which sum Three Hundred Pourds is due and payable to the Rev. Dr. John Devereux, as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by him, as owner of the Vicarial Tithes of said Parish; and Seventy-eight Pounds Ten Shillings are due, and payable to the Rev. Daniel Henry Wall, Caroline Wall (his wife), Elizabeth Hardy, and Harriet Hardy, (Spinsters), as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by them as Lay Impropriators of said Parish. And we do further certify that the average price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven years, ending on the 1st day of November, 1821, is Fourteen Shillings and One Farthing per Barrel.
