We Ralph Storey and James Willington, Commissioners for the Parish of Ballymacky, being duly Appointed and sworn under, and by Virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth intituled: "An Act, to provide for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time, do hereby Certify that the true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish of Ballymacky, as agreed upon at Special Vestry, held for that purpose is Three hundred and six pounds Thirteen Shillings and four pence Annually for Ballymacky, which sum is due and payable to the Honourable & Rev<sup>d</sup> Arthur Vesey as a Composition for the Tithes Claimable by him as Rector of said Parish, and One hundred and fifty three pounds Six Shillings & eight pence Sterling Annually for said Parish, which sum is due and payable to the said Honourable & Rev<sup>d</sup> Arthur Vesey, as a Composition for the Tithes Claimable by him as Vicar of said Parish, both which Sums together amount to Four hundred and sixty pounds Sterling p<sup>a</sup> Annum And we do further Certify that the Average price of Wheat, being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of Seven years, previous to and ending on the first of November 1821 is One pound eighteen Shillings & eight pence half penny - Given under our Hands this 27<sup>th</sup> Day of ~~October~~ <sup>September</sup> 1824
