7th day of February 1840.

We Francis Lynch Blayke and John Lynch duly appointed
Commissioners & Surveyors under & by virtue of an Act made in
fourth year of the reign of King George the fourth intituled an
act for the settling of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland
for a limited time to ascertain & fix a true & just Compo-
sition for all tithes arising growing, yielded or payable
within the Parish of Ballygowan in the County of Mayo, do hereby
Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all
Tithes whatever within the said Parish is one hundred
and sixty two pounds by the year of which sum of one hundred
and sixty two pounds there is three pounds five shillings
& two pence three farthings being two thirds part of the tithes
arising from the Lands the property of the See of Tuam in
the said Parish are due and payable to the Most James Dunne
as a Composition for the Tithe Claimable by him as
Bishop of Kill, & we do further Certify that the
average price of Oats being the Corn chiefly grown in
said County for the period of seven years ending on the
first day of November one thousand eight hundred
and twenty one is fifteen shilling and two pence one
farthing for Oats by the barrel late Currency.
