

— We John Barr of Greenocads Park and Frederick Stock of
Kilbulla Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by Virtue of an Act made
in the fourth year of the reign of King George the fourth intitled "An Act to provide for
the establishment of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland by a limited time" to ascertain
and fix a true and just composition for all Tithial Tithes arising from any ground, yielded or
payable within the Parish of Ballysahery in the County of Mayo To wit that a true
and just composition for all Tithial Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Two
hundred and nine pounds six shillings Sterling by the year; which said sum of
Two hundred and nine pounds six shillings Sterling is due and payable to the Vicar of
Joseph Verschoyle as Vicar of said Parish of Ballysahery as a composition for the
Tithes claimable by him as Vicar of the Tithial Tithes of said Parish

— And We do further certify that the average price of oats being the best
principally grown in such County for the period of seven years ending on the first
day of November 1831 is fifteen shillings and two pence farthing per barrel
