Burston* Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under, and by virtue of an Act made in the 2nd and 3rd year of WILLIAM the FORTH, "entitled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in 4th 5th and the 7th and 8th years of the Reign of his late Majesty KING GEO. the FORTH, providing for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent," to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of *Ballymaloo* in the County of *Wexford* do hereby certify, that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is  $\text{£ } 115. 8. 3\frac{1}{2}$  Pounds by the year, of which Sum of *one hundred & fifteen Pounds* *eight Shillings and three pence half penny* are due and payable to *the following persons* as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by *them*

*under lease of the Rectory of Ballymaloo*  $\text{£ } 55. 15. 0$

And I do further certify that the average price of *Wheat* being the Corn principally grown in such County, for the period of Seven years, ending on the *first* day of *January* 1830 thirty is  $\text{£ } 0. 12. 11\frac{1}{2}$  Shillings per Barrel. *as per* *bulletin from the Dublin Gazette*
