

Certificate of Commissioners for the Parish
of Beanteen in the County of Louth and Diocese of
Down - appointed under and by virtue of an Act passed
in the 4th year of the reign of King George the 4th
entituled an Act for the Establishment of Compositions for
Tithes in Ireland for a limited time -

We the Reverend Alexander Johnston and
Francis Donogh Esq. duly appointed and sworn Commissions-
ers under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year
of the reign of King George the 4th entituled an Act for
Establishing compositions for tithes in Ireland for a limited
time - to ascertain and fix a true and just composition
for all tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the
Parish of Beanteen in the County of Louth - Do here-
by certify, that the true and just composition for all
tithes whatsoever within the said Parish of Beanteen -
(according to the Agreement entered into by the Reverend
Jerome Atley Rector, and the Landholders of the said
Parish, at two Vestries held in and for the said Parish,
one of them on the 16th day of March 1827, and the other
on the 30th day of April 1827) is One hundred and
five pounds Sterling by the Year -

And we do further certify that the average
price of wheat and oats, being the principal corn grown in
said County for the period of seven years ending on the
8th day of November 1821 -

is - for wheat - £1.10.0 and for oats - £0.15.2¹/₄
