We Nicholas Brown and Robert Young, Commissioners duly appointed under and by virtue of existing acts of Parliament made in the 14th & 15th years of the reign of King George the fourth intituled a Act or Acts to ascertain and fix a true & just composition for all Tythes arising promising yielding or payable within the parish of Banagh in the County of Carlow & diocese of Leighlin.

Do hereby certify that the True and just Am^t of Composition for all Tythes ~~within~~ whatever within the said Parish is seven hundred and fifty pounds by the year, of which sum of 750 £ the third Parts are due and payable to Nicholas Brown, as a composition for the Tythes claimable by him as a lessee of the Rectory of Tythes from the dean and Chapter of Christ Church & St. Patrick's Cathedral Rectors of said Parish. One third part of said 750 £ is due and payable to Rev. Edward Pepper Vicar of said Parish of Banagh, the said Bishop of the Diocese having given his consent thereto, as hereunto annexed
