

I John Moore Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under
by virtue of an act made in the second and third years of the
reign of King William the fourth entitled an act to amend three
acts passed respectively, the fourth fifth seventh and eighth years
of His Late Majesty King George the fourth providing for the Establishing
of Composition for tithes in Ireland and to make such composition
permanent to ascertain and fix a true and just composition
for all tithes arising growing yielding and payable within the
Parish of Blackroath in the County of Kilkenny, do hereby
Certify that the true and just composition for all tithes
whatever within the said Parish is one hundred and fifty pounds
by the year, which sum is due and payable to the Rev^d
Gilbert Austin - as Rector of said Parish as a
composition for all tithes claimed by him, within said
Parish, I do further Certify that the average price of wheat
being the principal corn grown in such County for the
Period of seven years ending first November 1830 is one
pound twelve shillings & one half penny p^r barrel
