Appointed and Sworn, under and by Virtue of an Act  
made in the 2<sup>d</sup> and 3<sup>d</sup> years of the reign of King  
William the Fourth entitled an Act to amend  
Three Acts passed respectively in the 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>  
Years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the  
Fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for  
Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions  
permanant, to ascertain and fix a true and just  
Composition, in all Tithes, arising, growing, ~~and~~ yielded,  
or payable, within the Parishes of Behillane in the County  
of Cork and Diocese of Cloyne, do hereby Certify, that the  
true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes,  
whatever, within said Parish, is One Hundred and  
Ninety one Pounds, Ten Shillings, and Three pence,  
half penny, by the year, which sum of One Hundred and  
Ninety one Pounds, Ten Shillings, and Three pence,  
half penny, is due and payable by the year to the Reverend  
William Chatterton, as a Composition for the Tithes  
claimable by him, as Rector of the said Parish, and  
I do further Certify, that the average price of oats, being the  
Cere principally grown, in such County, for the period of  
seven years; ending on the first day of November 1830, being  
is Twelve Shillings and Seven pence half penny per Barrel
