

I John Plant Guynor, Commissioner duly appointed and sworn, under and by Virtue of an Act, made, in the 2, and 3, years of the Reign of King William the Fourth, entitled an Act to amend, three Acts, passed, respectively, in the 1st, 5th and in the 7th and 8th years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition, for all Tithes, arising, growing, yielded or payable, within the Parish of Bohillane in the County of Cork, and Diocese of Cloyne, do hereby Certify, that the True, and just Amount of Composition, for all Tithes, whatever within the said Parish, is One Hundred and Ninety One pounds, Ten Shillings, and Three pence halfpenny, by the year, which sum, of One Hundred and Ninety One pounds, Ten Shillings, and Three pence halfpenny, is due and payable by the year, to the Reverend William Chatterton, as a Composition for the Tithes Claimable by him, as Rector of the said Parish, and I do further Certify, that the average price of Cots, being the Corn principally grown in such County, for the period of seven years, ending, on the first day of November 1830, Thirty, is Twelve Shillings, and Eleven pence halfpenny per Barrel.
