

We Henry Blake and William G. Smith Commissioners  
duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act  
made in the fourth year of the reign of King George  
the fourth intituled "an Act to provide for the establishing  
of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time, to  
ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes  
arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish  
of Breaghwee in the County of Mayo" do hereby certify  
that the true and just amount of composition for all Tithes  
whatever within the said Parish is sixty two pounds  
thirteen shillings and three pence by the year, which  
sum is due and payable as a composition for the Tithes  
claimable by him as Rector of the said Parish.

And we do further certify, that the average price  
of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in such  
County for the period of seven years ending on the  
first day of November, 1821 one, was fifteen  
shillings and two pence farthing per barrel.
