

The Reverend William Ryder and William Kirby Esquire, Commissioners appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the Fourth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth Entitled an act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time. Do ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Britway in the County of Cork Do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is Two hundred and ninety seven pounds five Shillings and three half pence sterling by the year. The entire of which sum of Two hundred and ninety seven pounds five Shillings and three half pence is due and payable to the Honourable and Reverend Ludlow Tonson Rector of said Parish of Britway as a composition for the Tithe claimable by him as Rector of the said Parish.

And We do further certify that the average price of Wheat being the corn principally grown in the East Riding of the County of Cork for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November one thousand eight Hundred and twenty one is one pound eighteen shillings and eight pence half penny per barrel.
