Copy Appeals

To His Excellency Marquess Wellesley Lord  
Lieutenant of Ireland in Council

At a Vestry held at Bruce Church  
pursuant to a Notice under provisions of 2<sup>d</sup> and 3<sup>d</sup> William 4<sup>th</sup>  
and 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Geo. 4<sup>th</sup> for the purpose of taking into consideration  
the Comrs. Certificate of composition the persons composing  
the Vestry assembled have unanimously agreed to appeal  
against same demanding the sum of £1000 it being  
excessive and not taken according to law

That the Comrs. struck the Average for  
the Books at the Clergyman's house and refused the parish  
permission to be present thereat and refused all information by what  
rule or guide he struck said Average and also refused to hear  
any evidence altho tendered on behalf of the parish to lessen  
the Average and particularly refused to hear the evidence of  
William Brown who was the Valuator of said Parish for  
seven years previous to the year 1830

That the Vestry cannot state the particular  
Causes of Appeal for the different farms charged as tithes to  
them in the Field Books as they have been presented from  
mispecting or seeing the same and refused all information thereon  
and that the parish never exceeded the value of £400 a year  
and in the year 1828 it was offered to one of the Parishians  
at the annual Rent of £300 a year

And
