Appointment by the Lord Lieutenant as

in Burreo in order to induce the Parishioners to an amicable
composition, did not attend the Vestry himself, but the Parishioners
not having compounded, he was subsequently obliged to lay into
the Averages — Previous to doing so he perambulated the entire
parish and having viewed the different lands became well
acquainted with the qualities of the lands and extent and value
of the parish. He then called on the Agent of the Respondent to
attend before him on the 8th October 1833 to give evidence as
to the Averages, He will prove that on the day appointed, he
went from the Vicar's Globe House Burreo to the Village and
there met one of the Appellants Patrick O'Shaughnessy who was
