and dinners were, and in each case
a reduced Valuation was the consequence

He will prove that in the year 1829
Patrick O'Shaughnessy, ^{one of the Appellants} gave an order on
his Tenant Patrick Navigan Junr
for 10s worth of drink in consequence
of his reduced valuations. -

He will also prove that in the years
1820 a vast number of notices were
served by the Parish to take Tithes in
Kind and in that year immense
reductions were obliged to be made. -

Call Michl Collins. - To prove he Valued
in 1826. 1827. 1828. & 1829. In the first
year he was unacquainted with the
Boundaries of the Parish and was obliged
to depend on Willm Browne for informⁿ
In the following year 1827 he having
become acquainted with the Parish and
not dependt on Wm Browne, the Tithes
Valuations returned by him, & Browne
amounted to £670.- In 1820 the Parish
entered into Combination and served
notices and in order to save himself
the trouble attendant on receiving Tithes
in Kind, reduced the Valuations. -

He
