

Appointments of the Parish of Bumbler Diocese of Cyprian

And County of Roscommon

We Maurice Knox and Nicholas Arthur James Commissioners for Visiting and ascertaining a composition for the tithes of said Parish of Bumbler in the Union of Bumbler pursuant to the Acts of the 4th and 5th of George Fourth for establishing Compositions for tithes in Ireland for a limited time and having used the assistance of a competent and sworn Surveyor to ascertain us with more certainty of the extent and quality of lands in each townland and denomination in said Parish and having for several days perambulated and closely inspected the said lands We have according to the best of our judgment formed a true estimate and valuation thereof by dividing them into Clases and rating them according to their respective qualities as will more fully appear in the annexed Appointments And we find the Parish to contain Two thousand Seven hundred and Twenty three Acre One Rood and thirty three Perches or liable to pay towards said Composition in respect we have included the Town land of Wney containing One hundred Acres or thereabouts to be payment of the Composition for said Parish of Bumbler said Town land of Wney has before all times having been subject to the payment of tithes as part of the said Parish of Bumbler though it appears to the Commissioners that said lands of Wney are situate in the adjoining Parish of Kiltinstin of which

And We the said Commissioners further find the first Claps of Land to be of the Assessable Annual Value of £3 Sterling Consisting of Town Parks Gardens and prime meadows the second Claps to be of the Assessable Annual Value of £2 Sterling good for tillage or grazing and the third Claps to be of the Assessable Annual Value of £15 Sterling fit for feeding and tillage

And in pursuance of our said Statute duly amended we find that the Rev^d Edw^d Maheon as Vicar of said Parish is entitled to the Annual Sum of £139. 13. 11 late Irish Currency being the average of his part of the great Primal and mixed tithes of said Parish for the seven years from the 1st of January 1784 to the 1st of November 1821 And we further find that the said Edw^d Maheon is also entitled to the sum of £2 of the late Irish Currency as Vicar of said Parish as Composition for the small Primal (£1) and other matters connected therewith which two sums make in the whole the sum of £15. 13. 11 late Irish Currency being £10. 10. 5 British and which sum is chargeable upon the entire of said Parish And we further find that Messrs Richard Armstrong Sen^r and Rich^d Armstrong Jun^r and Charles Armstrong as Agents of the Com^r Impresariats of the great Primal and mixed tithes of said Parish are entitled to the Annual sum of £100. 10. 5 late Irish Currency being £100. 3. 6 British Chargeable upon the several Townlands in said Parish save and except that part thereof contained in the Demesne of the Right Hon^{ble} Lord St. Helens And we further find that the Rev^d George Vernon Successor of the Right Rev^d John Brently is entitled as Rector of said Parish to the sum of £22. 13. 0 late Irish Currency chargeable on the several Townlands contained in the said Demesne of Lord St. Helens and for the manner of Appointing same we refer to the following sheets

And we further certify that we have charged the first Claps of Land in said Parish at the rate of 3^d of British Currency per Acre the second Claps at the rate of 2^d 3^d per acre and the third Claps at the rate of 1^d 10^d per acre viz
