

Of such Patrons and Persons, and bodies Politic Corporate or Collegiate as aforesaid had been given and signified thereto in the form and manner prescribed in the said Acts in the Act under recital mentioned or either of them, and the said Union or Division duly completed thereunder.

And whereas in pursuance of the provisions in said recited Act contained an instrument in writing containing the proposed plan for the division of the Union of Burnchurch in the Diocese of Ossory and County of Kilkenny marked and coloured on sheets of the Ordnance Survey of Ireland, on which such parishes are situate and annexed to such instrument, and also for the Settlement or distribution of the Patronage of all the Parishes comprising such Union, and to be altered thereby, and having endorsed upon the same the approbation of Richard Archbishop of Dublin, being the Archbishop entitled to exercise Archiepiscopal Jurisdiction in the Province in which the Parishes comprising such Union as aforesaid are situate, and of James Thomas Lord Bishop of Ossory Ferm and Leighlin, being the person entitled to exercise Episcopal Jurisdiction within such Union as Diocesan thereof, certified under their hands was on the twenty fifth day of September in the year 1849, lodged in the Council Office in Dublin Castle at the instance of the said Lord Bishop of Ossory Ferm and Leighlin, and proposed by him. And whereas on the 26th and 27th days of said month of September 1849, a copy of the said proposed plan so approved of by the said Archbishop and Bishop as aforesaid with the Ordnance sheets referred to therein, and marked and coloured as aforesaid was sent to each of the Patrons whose Consent would have been rendered necessary to the effecting of the proposed division of the said Union of Burnchurch if the said recited Act of the 11th and 12th Victoria, Cap. 41, had not passed, and together with such copy and Ordnance sheets, a notice in writing was also served upon each of the said Parties calling on them within six weeks after the date of the service of such notice to lodge or cause to be lodged in the Council Office in Dublin Castle a Statement in writing of his or their objections to said Instrument or any part thereof, if any such they had. And whereas on the fifth day of November in the year of our Lord 1849 - The Reverend Thomas Stuart Townsend - D - D - Incumbent of the Union of Burnchurch caused to be lodged in the Council Office in Dublin Castle a Statement in writing of certain objections made by him to said proposed plan. And whereas such plan and instrument as aforesaid, and the objections of the said Reverend Thomas Stuart Townsend were taken into consideration as required by said Act. And whereas His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant and Privy Council, being of Opinion that the said plan should be altered in certain respects, did thereupon alter the same, and such instrument being so altered was thereupon returned to the said Lord Bishop of Ossory Ferm and Leighlin, by whom it was originally proposed and approved. And whereas such Instrument so altered as aforesaid has been sent back to the Privy Council Office with the approval of the said Lord Archbishop of Dublin, and Bishop of Ossory Ferm and Leighlin endorsed thereon, and which said Instrument so altered and approved of is in the words and figures following that is to say -

To His Excellency George William Frederick Earl of Chandos, Lord Lieutenant, General, and General Governor of Ireland ^{in Council} - The following plan for the division of the Union of Burnchurch otherwise Kiltraughn in the Diocese of Ossory, and for the annexing of the parts separated therefrom to other parishes in the same Diocese is submitted together with the sheets of the Ordnance Survey of Ireland in which the Parishes, ^{and parts of Parishes} to be divided, ^{and united} are situate, marked and coloured as required by the Act 11th and 12th Victoria, Cap. 41.
