aforesaid before the 30<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1851, the portion of the charge upon that parish which is to be paid next after the change takes place shall be borne by the incumbents in the proportion in which the net-charge for the half year is to be divided between them. As to the division of the patronage, it is proposed that after the Order in Council takes effect, the new Union of Burnchurch shall be in the gift of the Crown, and that the right of the Crown in the patronage of the other members of the Union, together with the rights of the Crown in the patronage of Odople, be transferred to the Bishop: and all the parishes to which these other members are to be united being in the gift of the Bishop, that the patronage of all the new Union shall thenceforth be in him: And it is proposed that the Order in Council embodying the foregoing Plan shall come into operation and take effect on the first day of May, 1850.

Now We, George William Frederick, Earl of Glanvill, Lord Lieutenant General and General Governor of Ireland, with the assent of the Privy Council, six at least assenting, and two at least of whom are members of the Judicial Bench, Do hereby adopt and confirm the said Instrument so altered, and recited as aforesaid, so far as the same relates to the Division of the said Union of Burnchurch, and the settlement and distribution of patronage therein made; and do hereby order and direct that the said Division of the said Union of Burnchurch, and the said distribution of the patronage thereof, do take effect from and after the first day of May instant.

And Whereas it appears unto Us that the Reverend Thomas Stuart Townsend, the present Incumbent of the said Union of Burnchurch has paid to the Representatives of his predecessor a sum of £2317:5:7 for building a Glebe House and other improvements in said Union, and it appears to Us just and reasonable that a sum of £1335:6:4*3* portion thereof, being equivalent to two years' income of the Benefice of Burnchurch hereby constituted should be chargeable and charged upon the said Benefice as hereby created, and that the residue thereof, being a sum of £981:19:2 should be charged upon and distributed amongst the parishes to be augmented, as set forth in said recited Instrument. Now We, the said Lord Lieutenant and Council as aforesaid do hereby further order and direct that the said Reverend Thomas Stuart Townsend the said Incumbent of the said Union of Burnchurch, be entitled to receive and shall receive from his next successor the sum of £1001:9:9*2*, and no more, being three fourths of said sum of £1335:6:4*3*, and that his successor having paid the same shall receive from his next successor chargeable the sum of £667:13:2*4*, and no more, being two thirds of the same so paid
