Hereby certify that the just and true amount of composition  
for all Tithes which shall be due within said Parish is  $\pounds 245.16$   
Two hundred and forty five <sup>pounds</sup> and sixteen <sup>pence</sup>  
pence which is due and payable to the Revd Henry Jennings  
Vicar of said Parish and further certify that the  
average price of Oats being the corn principally grown in such  
County for the space of seven years ending the 1<sup>st</sup> day of Oct:  
1821 is fifteen shillings per Bushel. Given under our hands  
the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of October 1821
