

in said parts of said Parish each charged with the annual payment of Three pounds Sterling and upwards in respect of said Rent Charge now payable in lieu of said Composition in said Parish and that the said notices of said application were signed by said Applicants and were duly posted and affixed at the times and in the manner prescribed by the Statutes to that intent made and provided did thereby order that the average price of good marketable cabs for the term of seven years next preceding said application be inquired of and ascertained from the Dublin Gazette and did thereby nominate and appoint Edward Heard Esquire of Ballinshelton Carrigrohull in the County of Cork to be an Arbitrator for ascertaining the average price of the barrel of good marketable cabs for the said term of seven years and to state and set forth such average price by his report in writing under his hand to be delivered to the Justices of the Peace assembled at the next ensuing General Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for said County Riding and Division that is to say the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be held at Cork in and for said County Riding and Division the sixth day of April next and did further order that the further consideration of the application

be adjourned to said last mentioned General Quarter Sessions for further consideration and order and that said General Quarter Sessions be also adjourned to said sixth day of April for the purposes of said application.

And the said application having pursuant to said last mentioned order come on for hearing before us the Justices assembled at these present General Quarter Sessions of the Peace and said Edward Heard having presented to us his report in writing as aforesaid.

Now we the said Justices having duly considered said report and having heard what was urged by counsel on behalf of said Applicants and also by counsel on behalf of Mr. Arthur Deane Esquire claiming to be entitled to said Composition and Rent Charge as Lay Impropriator of said Parish do hereby adjudge that the average price of good marketable cabs for the seven years preceding said application as ascertained by the said Edward Heard from the Dublin Gazette is Eleven shillings and one penny the barrel and that the said average price varies by more than a half from the average price of cabs set forth in the said Original Certificate of said John A. Braddell and John Mahony and accordingly we do adjudge and order that the
