

I Bartholomew Clifford Lloyd, Commissioner,
duly appointed and sworn, under and by
virtue of an act made in the 2nd and 3^d
years of the reign of King William the 4th
intituled "An act to amend three acts passed
respectively in the 4th, 5th and in the 7th and
8th years of the reign of his late Majesty
King George the 4th providing for the
establishing of compositions for tithes in
Ireland and to make such compositions
permanent" Do ascertain and fix a true
and just composition for all tithes arising
growing yielded or payable within the Parish
of Little Island in the County of Cork.

Do hereby certify, that the true and just
amount of composition for all tithes whatever
within the sd Parish is one hundred and
eighty pounds British by the year. The
whole of which sum is due and payable
to the Rev^d William Lewis Beaumont as
a composition for the tithe claimable by him
as Rector of the sd Parish.

And I do hereby certify that the average
price of oats being the corn principally
grown in such county for the period of seven
years ending on the 1st day of November 1830
is Twelve shillings & eleven pence half penny
per barrel.
