

I John Hill Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the second and third years of the reign of his Majesty King William the Fourth, entitled "An Act to amend three acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh and Eighth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent" to ascertain and fix a true and just composition within the Parish of Cannaway in the Diocese of Cork and County of Cork for all that portion of tithes of and within said Parish being the impropriate tithes arising growing, yielded or payable out of and within the District Ploughland or Townland of Shandangan part and parcel of the Parish of Cannaway aforesaid I do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of composition for all the Tithes whatever within the said District, Ploughland, or Townland of Shandangan, part parcel and portion of the said Parish of Cannaway is Thirty Six Pounds Eight Shillings & five Pence - by the year which sum is due and payable to his Grace The Duke of Devonshire as a composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Lay Impropriator of the said tithes of and within the said District Ploughland or Townland of Shandangan, part, parcel and portion of the said Parish of Cannaway in the County of Cork aforesaid, and I further Certify that the average price of wheat being the corn principally grown in such County during the period of seven years ending the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and thirty is one pound twelve shillings and one half penny per Bannel, and that the average price of Oats during the same period is Twelve shillings and seven pence half penny per Bannel, wheat and Oats being the corn principally grown in the County of Cork.
