

The Composition
Parish of Caragh.
Certificate.

I, William R. Sterling, Commissioner duly appointed
and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act, made in the
Second and Third year of the Reign of King William the
Fourth Intituled (An Act to amend three Acts passed relating
in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh and eighth years of the
Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing
for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland,
and to make such Compositions permanent,) to ascertain
and fix a true Composition for all Tithes arising, growing,
yielded or payable within the Parish of Caragh in the
County of Kildare, do hereby Certify that the true and just
amount of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever, within
the said Parish, is Two Hundred and five Pounds Sterling by
the year, of which sum of Two hundred and five Pounds
two third parts, (being a sum of one hundred and thirty six
Pounds, thirteen Shillings and four pence) are due and payable
to the Rev^d Walter Brough, as a Composition for the Tithes
claimable by him as Rector of the said Parish, and
one third part of the said yearly sum of Two hundred and five
Pounds, (being a sum of sixty eight Pounds, six Shillings
and eight pence Sterling) is due and payable to the Rev^d
Donald Grant, as a Composition for the Tithes claimable
by him as Vicar of the said Parish.

And I do further Certify that the average price
of wheat, (being the corn principally grown in such County)
for the period of seven years ending on the first Day of November
1830 (Thirty) is Thirty two Shillings and one Halfpenny Sterling
per Barrel.
